### A Message from our CEO and Board President

In 1999 we provided social services to residents in five counties through seven state and federal programs. Changes in legislation eliminated or modified several of our programs, including: Even Start, Subsidized Childcare, KidCare, USDA Food Programs, etc. In our 47 years of operation, CDS staff experienced numerous funding and legislative changes, which created opportunities for expansion as well as periods of contraction. To mitigate contraction and loss of economies of scale, CDS aggressively expanded into 42 counties throughout Florida with new or existing programs. To diminish fluctuations in funding sources, we also expanded and enhanced our realm of services to 14 programs. Our goal is to offer a comprehensive set of services in communities, tailored to each community's specific needs.

Currently, only three of our 14 programs are proprietary (developed and owned by CDS). Proprietary programs and products allow CDS to:

Create highly customized services for clients and communities Generate unrestricted revenue to offset funding fluctuations and unallowable expenses

License and sell products to a diverse set of target markets – without territorial restrictions

Develop a corporate identity as a leader in early childhood education throughout Florida and beyond

Develop distinctive corporate branding based on copy write and trademark protected products and Unique Selling Points

Our goal is to develop and offer proprietary products and services as value-added offerings, opposed to replacements for our existing programs. We plan on integrating many of our CDS-specific programs with existing programs, which will offer wrap-around services to our clients. Clients and stakeholders in our largest programs, Head Start and Early Head Start, will benefit from these exclusive services.

Over the next few years, we will rollout several new products and services – all focused on helping our clients become self-sufficient.
